
POPULAR SOVEREIGHTS

- All Power is held by the People
- The <u>power</u> to govern is <u>given</u> through the <u>Constitution</u>
- Amendments protecting <u>sovereignty</u>:
 - > 15th
 - African Americans
 - > 17th
 - Senators elected directly
 - > 19th
 - Women
 - > 24th
 - Outlawed poll tax
 - > 26th
 - Voting age lowered to 18

2. Limited Government

- ❖ Government can <u>only do what the</u> <u>people give it the power to</u> do
 - Rule of Law- Those who govern must also obey the law

3. Separation of Powers



- LegislativeBranch makethe laws
 - Represents a district or state
 - Serves 2 or 6 years

- ExecutiveBranch –enforces thelaws
 - Represents the whole country
 - Serves 4 years


- Judicial Branch interprets the laws
 - Represents the Constitution
 - > Serves for life



4. Checks and Balances



- Each Branch is checked by the other branches
- Ensures one branch does not have all the power



5. Federalism

- The sharing of powers between the national and state governments
- Some powers are delegated to the national gov't and some are reserved for the states
- States have their own laws, courts, constitutions, and elected officials

6. Judicial Review

- Power of the <u>court to determine the</u> <u>constitutionality of a government</u>
- Supremacy Clause US Constitution is the supreme law of the land
