The Cabinet Departments

- Not specifically mentioned in the Constitution
- Original 4: Department of State, Department of the Treasury, Department of War, Department of Justice
- Secretary of ______
 - Except Attorney General
- Trusted most officials of the President
- Part of the Line of Succession
 - 25th Amendment





Department of State

- Responsibility- Foreign Policy
- Secretary of State,
 Ambassadors and consuls
- Embassy's- Official residence of Ambassador
- 'Eyes and ears' of the President

Department of Defense

- Responsibility- Armed Forces
- Secretary of Defense, Joint Chiefs of Staff, military personnel
- Used for relief and military action



The Original 4 Departments

Department of Justice

- Responsibility- enforce laws of United States and ensure public Safety
- Attorney General
- ❖ FBI



Also an independent agency

Department of the Treasury

- Responsibility- promote conditions for economic prosperity and stability
- Secretary of the Treasury
- Collect and enforce tax laws (IRS)
- Produce currency
- Supervise national banks



- Examples: NASA, Office of Management and Budget. Social Security Administration, CIA
- Includes <u>regulatory</u> <u>commissions</u>
- Narrow area of responsibility
