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## Mercantilism

* England established colonies to make a profit for themselves
* Country's power is determined by its wealth



## Navigation Acts

* Required that ALL
 shipments had to go through English ports
* Enabled England to collect duties in colonies
* Reflected policy of mercantilism



## Albany Plan of Union (1754)

* Failed plan to unify colonies for mutual defense led by Benjamin Franklin
1st attempt at a united American gov't
Explain this political cartoon



## French and Indian War

* English War against the French and the Indians
$>$ English v. French \& Indian


England forced the colonists to fight in the war and pay the costs of the war (Taxes)


## Proclamation of 1763

* England banned
settlements West of the Appalachian Mountains at the end of the French and Indian War
* Why would this upset the colonist?
$>$ They just helped England fight for this land!!



## Salutary Neglect

* Until $\sim 1765$, GB did not enforce its laws in the colonies, including most taxation Colonist developed their own governments and way of life
$>$ Virginia House of Burgesses $-1^{\text {st }}$ representative gov't
$>$ Fundamental Orders of Connecticut - $1^{\text {st }}$ state constitution
$>$ Mayflower Compact - Everyone on the Mayflower would get to vote on every issue



## Stamp Act (1765)

* Items must be British made and have a special stamp
* Colonists decided to Boycott British goods in response to the taxes
* Why would the colonist not think this was justifiable?
$>$ Popular Sovereignty is not being upheld!


## "No Taxation Without Representation!"

* Colonists did not have a say in the government of England; so they shouldn't be taxed by them
$>$ Again, no popular sovereignty



## Stamp Act Congress (1765)

* Nine colonies met and sent a declaration against British actions to king
* First time a majority of the colonies joined together to oppose British rule

* Effect: GB gov't repealed (cancelled) the Stamp Act


## Townshend Acts 1767

* Taxes on variety of goods (paper, paint, lead, glass, and tea that were imported into the colonies) and allowed British customs officers to search for smuggling
Meant to replace Stamp Act
* Colonists began to cause trouble for officials


## Boston Massacre (1770)

* British soldiers fired into a crowd, killing five people


Crispus Attucks is a name synonymous with the Boston Massacre. He was not only the first African American to die for the revolution, he was one of the first patriots to give his life for the cause.
